My name is Stephen Schmidt. I joined the USMC in December 1973 and spent three years on embassy duty in my first four years. I married a wonderful woman from Finland and reenlisted for four more years. After 15 years in the Corps with tours in Hawaii, Okinawa, Equator, Finland, Hawaii, and California, I got out. We moved to Washington where I enlist-

ed in the Washington Army National Guard for 7 years and retired. During my tour I spent 12 months in Iraq in 2004 –2005 serving as the 81st Brigade Combat Team Chaplains Assistant. I turned 50 in Iraq which I believed helped me with the soldiers that have never been outside the state of Washington.

For a while I had a few very scared soldiers in our company and spent a bit of time with them explaining what this war was all about. I held a Bible study which helped some of these soldiers get closer to God. As of now I volunteer at the Washington Tahoma National Cemetery on Tuesday escorting families into the shelters for their funeral services. I also am on the VFW Post 6785 Honor Guard and provide services twice a month at the cemetery. I have been mailing welcome letters to those veterans who are assigned to our post but not attending meetings, and I am attempting to reach out to our post members and those in need as that is my calling.

Part of the VFW vision is to ensure veterans are recognized for the sacrifices they and their loved ones have made on behalf of this great country. Yesterday, I had the honor of visiting the Compass House in Renton, WA

to recognize veterans who recently passed away this year.

The Compass House is a Veterans Resource Center. With 59 units of permanent housing for Veteran individuals and families, the Renton Veterans Center offers a variety of Veteran-specific services. Reading groups and art classes for children in our youth center engage young residents, and case management services help adults find the support they need. The program is open to homeless veterans or homeless Veterans with families earning from zero to 60% of area median income.
